14.4 Representation to other agencies

The institution (a) represents itself accurately to all U.S. Department of Education recognized accrediting agencies with which it holds accreditation and (b) informs those agencies of any change of accreditation status, including the imposition of public sanctions.

Compliance Judgment: In Compliance

Rationale

Federally Recognized Regional Accrediting Agency. The University of South Carolina Aiken is accredited by one U.S. Department of Education recognized accrediting body, the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools Commission on Colleges (SACSCOC). USC Aiken was last reaffirmed by the Commission on Colleges in 2011.

Specialized Program Accreditation. Table 14.4-1 shows that several of USC Aiken programs are accredited by professional or specialized accrediting agencies. All externally accredited programs go through the same or similar steps to initiate accreditation, become accredited, and maintain accreditation status in good standing. These steps include reviewing standards, preparing a self-study document allowing the program to measure its performance against the established standards, on-site evaluation which allows accreditation team members to determine and validate firsthand that the applicant meets the established standards, ongoing monitoring to assure that the program continues to meet standards throughout the granted period of accreditation, and periodic re-evaluation to ascertain whether continuation of accreditation status is warranted.
