4.1 Governing board characteristics

The institution has a governing board of at least five members that:

- (a) is the legal body with specific authority over the institution;
- (b) exercises fiduciary oversight of the institution;
- (c) ensures that both the presiding officer of the board and a majority of other voting members of the board are free of any contractual, employment, personal, or familial financial interest in the institution;
- (d) is not controlled by a minority of board members or by organizations or institutions separate from it; and
- (e) is not presided over by the chief executive officer of the institution.

Compliance Judgment: In Compliance

Rationale

Legal body with authority over the institution. The Board of Trustees of the University of South Carolina was created on December 19, 1801 by virtue of §59-117-<u>10 et seq.</u>^[1], Code of Laws of South Carolina to have authority over all institutions in the University of South Carolina system. The institutions that constitute the University of South Carolina are delineated in the Bylaws of the USC Board of Trustees ^[2] and include a research institution (USC Columbia), three comprehensive institutions (USC Aiken, USC Beaufort, USC Upstate) and four 2-year regional campuses (USC Lancaster, USC Salkehatchie, USC Sumter, USC Union). The <u>USC system</u> organizational chart ^[3] illustrates the USC system structure and the relationship of USC Aiken to the USC Board of Trustees.

Governing board of at least five members. As stipulated in <u>Section 10 of the</u> <u>59-117 Code of Laws</u> ^[4], the <u>Board of Trustees of the University of South Carolina</u> ^[5] is composed of three ex-officio members - the Governor of the State (or his designee), the State Superintendent of Education, and the President of the Greater University of South Carolina Alumni Association; seventeen other members including one member from each of the sixteen judicial circuits to be elected by the general vote of the General Assembly and one at large member appointed by the Governor.

Pursuant to the <u>South Carolina Code of Laws §59-117-20 ^[6]</u> and the <u>Board of</u> <u>Trustees Bylaws, Article II, Section 2 ^[7]</u>, the regular term of office for each member elected by the General Assembly is four years with the terms commencing on July 1 of the year of election and expiring on June 30 four years later. The terms are staggered by Judicial Circuits as prescribed by the Legislature. Currently, members from the 1st, 3rd, 5th, 7th, 9th, 11th, 12th and 13th Judicial Circuits are elected at one time and members from the 2nd, 4th, 6th, 8th, 10th, 14th, 15th and 16th Judicial Circuits are elected two years later. The Board of Trustees Bylaws further state in Section 3 that "if a vacancy occurs among the sixteen members elected by the General Assembly when the General Assembly is not in session, the Governor may fill such vacancy by appointment until the next session of the General Assembly."

Exercises fiduciary oversight of the institution. The powers of the Board are prescribed by the provisions of the <u>South Carolina Code of Laws §59-117-40</u>^[8] and include among other things the power "to accept, receive and hold all moneys or other properties, real and personal, that may be given, conveyed, bequeathed or devised to the University and to use them for the benefit of the University." The duties and responsibilities of the Board of Trustees are outlined in the <u>Board of Trustees Bylaws</u>, <u>Article IV, Section 1</u>^[9] and include the fundamental responsibilities to "define the mission, role and scope of the University System and each of its major component institutions,... establish the general policies of the University System,... lay out the University System's broad program of educational activity, ...approve the budget for the next fiscal year, and...provide ultimate accountability to the public and the General Assembly." Responsibilities of each individual member of the Board of Trustees are specified in the <u>Board of Trustees Bylaws</u>, <u>Article III</u> ^[10] and include among other things honoring "his/her fiduciary responsibility to the University System and the Board as a whole."

The University of South Carolina's Board of Trustees is an active governing body. The Secretary keeps minutes of the proceedings of the Board and each committee. The guidelines for the Board meetings, including the meeting schedule, agendas, minutes of the Board and committee proceedings are described in detail in the <u>Board of Trustees</u> <u>Bylaws, Articles IX and X.</u>^[11] The University of South Carolina Board of Trustees regularly takes actions relative to USC Aiken that are recorded in the Board of Trustees meeting minutes. Illustrative actions taken in the last couple of years are presented in Table 4.1 with links to minutes. These documents demonstrate that the Board of Trustees exercises fiduciary oversight of USC Aiken.

Free of any contractual, employment, personal, or familial financial interest in the institution. Neither the presiding officer of the Board nor any of the other voting members has contractual, employment, personal, or familial financial interest in the institution. As stipulated in the <u>Board of Trustees Bylaws, Article II, Section 4</u>^[31], the voting members of the Board of Trustees serve without compensation but are entitled to draw per diem and expenses. The Board of Trustees has a policy addressing <u>conflict of interest</u> ^[32] for its members. The policy states that members of the Board of Trustees who have a conflict of interest "shall abstain from any discussion with any Board member, formal or informal, and any vote regarding the transaction or arrangement that results in the conflict of interest."

Among the individual trustee responsibilities specified in <u>Article III of the Board of</u> <u>Trustees Bylaws</u> ^[10], board members are to "avoid conflicts of interest and self-dealing with the University; and refrain from engaging in personal agendas that conflict with actions of the Board or the advancement of the institution as a whole."

Not controlled by a minority of board members or by organizations or institutions separate from it. The Board has several procedures to ensure it is not controlled by a minority of board members or outside organizations. The process for the Board meetings is delineated in <u>Article X of the Board of Trustees Bylaws</u> ^[33] and includes a roll call to ensure the presence of a quorum before actions are taken. As specified in Section 2 of Article X of the Board of Trustee Bylaws, "eleven members of the Board shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business." Further, as stipulated in <u>Sections 10 and 11 of Article X of the Board of Trustee Bylaws</u> ^[34], "the use of proxies for purposes of determining a quorum, for voting, or for any other purposes shall not be permitted." Issues that come before the Board are, "determined by a majority vote of the members present." The results of the roll call and the presence of members to meet quorum are noted in the minutes of each meeting, as illustrated in the minutes of meetings held June 22, 2018 ^[35] and <u>February 8, 2019</u>. ^[36]

Not presided over by the chief executive officer of the institution. As stipulated in Article VI of the Board of Trustees Bylaws ^[37], the Ex Officio Chairman of

the Board is the Governor of South Carolina who, when present, presides at all meetings of the Board. A permanent Chairman of the Board presides at all meetings of the Board in the absence of the Ex Officio Chairman and serves as the spokesperson of the Board. The <u>roster of the Board of Trustees</u> ^[5] identifies the ex officio chair of the Board of Trustees as Governor Henry McMaster. The Chairman of the Board of Trustees is John C. von Lehe. An examination of the roster of board members shows that the chief executive officer of USC Aiken, Chancellor Sandra J. Jordan, is not a member of the Board of Trustees. The authority and duties of the Chancellor are delineated in <u>Section 3 of Article XII of the Board of Trustees</u>.
