4.2.b Board/administrative distinction

The governing board ensures a clear and appropriate distinction between the policymaking function of the board and the responsibility of the administration and faculty to administer and implement policy.

Compliance Judgment: In Compliance

Rationale

Authority and Duties of the Govern Board. The University of South Carolina Aiken is governed by the Board of Trustees of the University of South Carolina System. The powers of the University of South Carolina Board of Trustees are prescribed in the provisions of the <u>South Carolina Code of Laws Section 59-117-40</u> ^[1] and are delineated in <u>Article IV of the Board of Trustees Bylaws</u>.^[2] As outlined in the Board of Trustees Bylaws, "the Board…shall establish the general policies of the University System, shall lay out the University System's broad program of educational activity, shall approve the budget for the next fiscal year, and shall provide ultimate accountability to the public and the General Assembly. Within these fundamental responsibilities, the Board will perform, where appropriate, many essential functions, including but not limited to… establish policies and goals of the University and direct the President to implement and achieve those policies and goals; … approve compensation policy for faculty and staff; [and] …establish auditing policies and standards and appoint independent auditors."

The broad categories of governing board policies and documents illustrating related actions taken (e.g., agenda or minutes of meetings) include:

- Setting governing and administrative policies: (e.g., <u>adopting a mission</u> review policy ^[3]; <u>setting an internal control policy and specifying personnel</u> with delegated authority over specific policy areas ^[4]);
- Budget and Finance: (e.g., <u>approval of a designated fund budget for</u> <u>scholarships</u> ^[5]; <u>approval of the USC System budget</u> ^[6]; <u>approval of state</u> <u>institution refunding bonds</u> ^[7]);

- Real estate and facilities: (e.g., <u>facility renovations</u> ^[8]; <u>campus construction</u> projects ^[9]; <u>facility maintenance</u> ^[10]; <u>approval of Comprehensive Permanent</u> <u>Improvement Plans</u> ^[11]);
- Personnel matters: (e.g., <u>approval of the Faculty Manual</u>^[12]; <u>approval of honorary titles</u>^[13]; <u>appointment of the institution's Chancellor</u>^[14]);
- Legal and contractual matters: (e.g., approval of large contracts ^[15]); and
- Approving missions and educational programs: (e.g., review of the institution mission ^[16]; approval of new academic programs ^[17]).

Process of Adopting and Modifying Policies. The university system uses a standard policy format and a uniform review and approval process for university policies to improve communication, promote administrative consistency and efficiency, and ensure compliance with pertinent state and federal laws as well as state and regional accreditation requirements. All institutions and campuses of the USC system must follow the procedures outlined in the <u>Policy on Policies</u> ^[18] regarding the approval of new university policies and the revision or repeal of existing policies. All system-wide university policies with the exception of Board of Trustee policies must be approved by the president. Board of Trustees policies must be reviewed by the Office of General Counsel prior to approval by the Board of Trustees. Drafts of new policies, substantially revised policies, and policies recommended for repeal must be distributed to the university community for review and comment prior to final approval.

Dissemination of Policies. University-approved versions of policies for the system and USC Columbia are disseminated through an online <u>Policies and Procedures</u> <u>Manual</u>. ^[19] Policies specific to USC Aiken are maintained by the office of the Chancellor and are available on the USC Aiken Policy and Procedures website. ^[20]

Administration and Implementation of Policies. As a senior campus in the University of South Carolina system, USC Aiken has extensive autonomy and local decision-making capacity within the context of organizational policies and system-wide approval processes. Illustrative examples of the autonomous administration and implementation of policies include:

- Institutional planning: (e.g., developing a campus master plan ^[21]; developing a strategic plan ^[22]; developing a budget and establishing budgetary priorities ^[23]);
- Curricular decisions: (e.g., adopting new courses or modifying existing courses ^[24]; developing new programs of study ^[25]; evaluating the <u>General Education core</u> ^[26], <u>undergraduate programs of study</u> ^[27], and <u>graduate programs of study</u> ^[28]);
- Hiring and personnel issues: (e.g., <u>faculty recruitment</u> ^[29]; <u>hiring of</u> <u>classified personnel</u> ^[30]; <u>recommendations of tenure and promotion</u> ^[31]; <u>post-</u> <u>tenure reviews</u> ^[32]);
- Student matters: (e.g., making admissions decisions ^[33]; disciplinary
 actions ^[34]; awarding financial aid and scholarships ^[35]; campus housing ^[36]);
- Academic matters: (e.g., assigning grades ^[37]; appeals of grades and probation and suspension decisions ^[38]; grade changes ^[39]; transfer of credit decisions ^[40]; documenting transfer credits ^[41]).
