## **Compliance**

The university provides clear grievance procedures for academic and non-academic complaints. Using a stage process that begins as an informal discussion, the university employees a Ombud's person to provide students assistance with appointments available upon request and 6 open hours a week. The Ombud's person serves as a resource for students who may not be aware of every university channel to resolve their related issue. Procedures for formal complaints are outlined within the student handbook. The university also has a dedicated webpage related to student complaints through academic affairs that give guidelines for filling a complaint and also directs students to the option of filing a complaint with the South Carolina Commission on Higher Education. Although there have been no formal academic or non-academic complaints filed in the past 10 years, the institution states that such files would be securely stored in the Human Resource Department if filed.
