Compliance

The Off-Site Reaffirmation Committee reviewed the Faculty Manual sections titled, "Courses and Curricula Committee", "Graduate Advisory Council", "Academic Assessment Committee", and "General Education Committee" and found evidence that full-time faculty members are responsible for curriculum and program quality, integrity, review and assessment. The institution's narrative Table 6.2.b-2 Full-time and Part-time Faculty by Academic Program (2019-2020) provides evidence that sufficient full-time faculty are employed for each degree program regardless of delivery method or site. For academic year 2019-2020, undergraduate programs have sufficient full-time faculty, accounting for at least 56% of program faculty. Graduate program faculty employed for all modalities of delivery. In all but four programs, at least 60% of the faculty assigned to the program are full-time.
